About This Guide

This guide contains detailed descriptions of the Livescribe[™] smartpen and applications that run on it. Use this guide along with the *Getting Started Guide* included with the Livescribe smartpen. For information about desktop software that works with the Livescribe smartpen, see the *Livescribe* TMDesktop User Guide.

Note: This guide instructs you to tap on paper controls to perform certain functions. When you see this instruction, turn on your smartpen, and use the ink tip to tap on the printed buttons within the *Getting Started Guide* and Livescribe™ Dot Paper notebooks.

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1 Introducing the Livescribe™ Smartpen

Congratulations on the purchase of your new Livescribe[™] smartpen. This topic introduces you to the Livescribe[™] smartpen. Livescribe Smartpen

Livescribe is fundamentally changing the way people capture, access and share information with pen and paper. Livescribe has developed a breakthrough low-cost mobile computing platform, which includes the award-winning Livescribe smartpen, dot paper, smartpen applications, Livescribe Desktop software, Livescribe Online Community, and development tools.

The Livescribe[™] smartpen is an advanced paper-based computer in the form of a pen that records everything you hear and write. It synchronizes the audio your hear to what you write, so you never miss a word. Just tap on your notes and the smartpen will play back what you recorded from that exact moment in time.

The smartpen provides both audio and visual feedback, powerful processing capabilities, and substantial built-in storage. The smartpen integrates several components and technologies. It also uses firmware and application software to support the interaction of all of its components and to enable built-in handwriting recognition, and applications such as Paper Replay™, among many others.


When you power on your Livescribe smartpen and begin writing on Livescribe[™] dot paper, the smartpen captures and stores the notes you write. To capture your writing, the smartpen uses its built-in infrared camera to take digital snapshots of a special dot pattern on the paper as the tip moves over the paper while you write. See *Livescribe[™] Dot Paper on page 2* for information about the dot pattern.

When recording audio in a Paper Replay[™] session, the smartpen links the recorded audio to your notes based on the dot pattern on the page. With this information, the smartpen can play back the audio that was recorded at the exact time you were writing your notes. Specifically, when you tap on your notes with the smartpen, it locates the position where you are tapping and starts to play back the audio at the position linked to that paper location.

Livescribe™ Dot Paper

To perform its many operations, your Livescribe smartpen requires Livescribe[™] dot paper. This paper is standard paper with printed microdots on its surface. These dots are nearly invisible to the human eye. However, the smartpen can easily see these dots and uses them to know which page you are writing on and the exact location on that page. The smartpen can even see these dots through the ink you write on your pages.

The microdot pattern on each page is based on technology from Anoto AB. This dot pattern consists of small dots (100 micrometers in diameter) arranged with a spacing of approximately 0.3 mm. The dot pattern overlays an imaginary square grid. The dots are slightly displaced from the grid, with each dot in one of four possible positions, forming the proprietary Anoto dot pattern.



The dot pattern identifies the specific page and locations on the page of the notes you write. Your Livescribe smartpen uses the dot pattern in a way similar to a geographical positioning system (GPS). But, instead of identifying locations on land, it finds locations on paper and stores your writing as digital

ink using those locations. Using this patented dot-positioning system (DPS), the smartpen precisely tracks its own movement on paper. As a result, anything you write – words, numbers or drawings – can be stored, recognized, and intelligently responded to by the smartpen.

The area of the entire Anoto dot pattern is huge, and represents a piece of paper the combined size of Europe and Asia. Livescribe™ dot paper is based on a portion of this dot pattern.

New Features

Support for Livescribe Paper Tablet


The Livescribe Paper Tablet enables your Echo smartpen to work as an input device on your computer. The Paper Tablet is similar to a graphics tablet. You connect your smartpen to your computer using its micro-USB cable and use it like a stylus. You then use one or more pages from a Livescribe™ dot paper product as the tablet. The Paper Tablet is available for purchase from the Livescribe Store and from Livescribe retailers as a redeemable application card. Livescribe Sticky Notes


Livescribe Sticky Notes take the familiarity and convenience of sticky notes—small pieces of paper with a strip of repositionable adhesive on the back—and add the power of Livescribe dots.

You can quickly capture short notes, lists, and reminders while adding audio to them. Attach Livescribe Sticky Notes to any printout, magazine, or book page to add personalized interactive notes. As with other Livescribe dot paper products, transfer your Sticky Notes to your desktop computer to organize, search, or share them with others.

Sticky Notes pads come in two sizes. The 3"x3" Livescribe Sticky Note looks like this:



The 3" x 5" Livescribe Sticky Note looks like this:



Packs and Pads

Each pad of Livescribe Sticky Notes contains 75 sheets. Pads are sold in packs of six: three pads of 3"x3" and three pads of 3"x5".

Use only one Livescribe pack at a time. You should proceed as follows:

- 1. Use up all the pads in one pack.
- 2. Archive the pads.
- 3. Open a new pack.


Your smartpen can carry up to 6 pads (Sticky Notes 3"x3" Pads 1, 2, 3 and Sticky Notes 3"x5" Pads 1, 2, 3) at the same time. When you are done with all six pads, archive them with Livescribe Desktop before starting a new 6-pack. Please do not use identical pads from different 6-packs at the same time, because your smartpen will recognize them as the same pad.

New Buttons

Livescribe Sticky Notes come with the familiar Nav Plus and **Paper Replay** buttons printed along the bottom edge. Along the top edge, Sticky Notes have buttons that are new to the Livescribe paper product line.

The **Home Button** stops the current smartpen application and returns you to the default display (which shows the current time).



The three **Shortcut Buttons** have functionality that you assign to them.


Home Button

Tapping on the **Home Button** stops the currently running smartpen application and returns the smartpen to its default mode: The current time is showing on the display and the smartpen is ready to store whatever you write on Open Paper.

Home Button in New and Old Livescribe Notebooks

On Livescribe Sticky Notes and newer Livescribe notebooks and journals, the Home Button is represented by the icon of a house. For an illustration of the house icon, see <u>New Buttons on page 6</u>.

Although new in this version, the **Home Button** functionality is available on older Livescribe notebooks as well. Instead of a house, however, look for a faintly printed circle to the right of the pre-printed Nav Plus in the corner of each page. The black arrow in the following illustration points to the circle that acts as the **Home Button**.



Double-Tap Can Be Set by You

Besides single-tapping on the **Home Button**, you can also double-tap on it. By default, both actions do the same thing. However, you can assign different functionality to double-tapping the **Home Button**. You can assign any Open Paper smartpen application or Quick Command. For instance, if you do lots of calculations, you might want to go to Calc Quick Command when you double-tap on the **Home Button**.

To set the **Home Button** to launch an Open Paper smartpen application or perform a Quick Command:

1. Double-tap the center of the Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

Main Menu will be displayed on the Livescribe smartpen.



Tap down on the directional arrow of the Nav Plus to scroll through a list of applications on the Livescribe smartpen.



4. When **Shortcuts** is displayed, tap right to select it.



The display will scroll: Assign Home Button double-tap. Tap right.




- 6. The display will scroll: Write a command, then double-tap. You can write an application name or a Quick Command.
- Write any Open Paper smartpen application name or write a Quick Command. For instance, write calc

Note: Do **not** double-tap the center of the Nav Plus or write a doubled-back horizontal line. Write only the letters that make up the Quick Command.









8. The display will briefly display the smartpen application name or Quick Command. Then it will confirm the new assignment.

For instance, it will briefly show the Calc Quick Command. Then it will start scrolling:

Home Button is Now Assigned To [calc]



Shortcut Buttons

Shortcut Buttons appear on some of the newer Livescribe[™] dot paper products, such as Livescribe Sticky Notes. They are labeled with successive numbers: 1, 2, 3, etc.



You can assign functionality to the **Shortcut Buttons**, just as you can assign functionality to double-tapping the **Home Button**. Assign any Open paper smartpen application or Quick Command to a **Shortcut Button**.

To set **Shortcut Button 1** follow these steps. We will set **Shortcut Button 1** to the Calc Quick Command:

1. Double-tap the center of the Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

2. Main Menu will be displayed on the Livescribe smartpen.



3. Tap down on the directional arrow of the Nav Plus to scroll through a list of applications on the Livescribe smartpen.



4. When **Shortcuts** is displayed, tap right to select it.

5. The display will scroll:

Assign Home Button double-tap. Tap down to display Assign Shortcut 1. (Tap down again to display Assign Shortcut 2, etc.)




6. When you see the number of the shortcut you wish to set, tap right.



- 7. The display will scroll: Write a command, then double-tap. You can write an application name or a Quick Command.
- 8. Write any Open Paper smartpen application name or write a Quick Command. For instance, write calc

Note: Do **not** double-tap the center of the Nav Plus or write a doubled-back horizontal line. Write only the letters that make up the Quick Command.







The display will briefly show the smartpen application name or Quick Command. Then it will confirm the new assignment.

For instance, it will briefly show the Calc Quick Command. Then it will start scrolling:

Shortcut Button 1 is Now Assigned To [calc]





Tapping on an Unassigned Shortcut Button

Unlike the **Home Button**, the **Shortcut Buttons** have no default assignments. If you tap on an unassigned **Shortcut Button**, the following message displays on the smartpen: **To assign this shortcut**, tap and hold the button, then write the name of an application or Quick Command.

To set an unassigned **Shortcut Button** by tapping directly on it, follow these steps. We will set **Shortcut Button 1** to the Calc Quick Command.

 Tap and hold the Shortcut Button you want to set for three seconds—for instance, tap and hold Shortcut Button 1.




2. The display will scroll: Write a command, then double-tap. You can write an application name or a Quick Command.



Write any Open Paper smartpen application name or write a Quick Command. For instance, write calc

Note: Do **not** double-tap the center of the Nav Plus or write a doubled-back horizontal line. Write only the letters that make up the Quick Command.



4. The display will briefly show the smartpen application name or Quick Command. Then it will confirm the new assignment.

For instance, it will briefly show the Calc Quick Command. Then it will start scrolling:

Shortcut Button 1 is Now Assigned To [calc]





If you accidentally tap on an unassigned **Shortcut Button** and you do not wish to set it at this time, tap on any Open Paper.

Improvements and Corrected Issues

Smartpen performance has been optimized is several ways. Also, several existing features of the smartpen software have been refined to increase intuitiveness and flexibility.

Performance Improvement

- Faster booting: When powering on, the smartpen loads its software more quickly and is ready to
 use in less time.
- Faster transfer speed: Data transfer to and from the smartpen occurs at a faster rate.
- Faster file access in Echo: The Echo smartpen reads data from and writes data to its file system more efficiently, improving responsiveness in the loading and operation of smartpen applications.

Left-Tap: Exit the Way You Came In

Left-tap is the way to the exit on the smartpen. You can tap left on the directional error of a Nav Plus to exit a smartpen application or a Quick Command. You can also exit by left-tapping around any Launch Lines you drew. See <u>Launch Line and Tap Around on page 67</u>.

In this version of the smartpen software, the results of left-tapping in any situation were standardized to be intuitive and helpful. If you are curious, the rule is: You exit the way you came in. This means that left-tapping leads you back toward your starting place:

- If you started by tapping Nav Plus and navigating the Main Menu, then left-tap leads you back to the Main Menu.
- If you started by drawing a Launch Line or Quick Command on Open Paper, then we assume you do not care about the **Main Menu** right now: the current time is displayed instead.
- In either case, you end up in the same state: no application is running and the smartpen is ready to store the next thing you write on Open Paper.

NOTE: Left-tapping from the submenu of a smartpen application or Quick Command backtracks up the menu hierarchy toward the root level. Left-tapping from the root level jumps to Main Menu or the current time display, as described above.

Note: The root level of a launched application is the initial menu displayed when you launch the application. The root level of a running Quick Command is the list displayed when you execute the Quick Command. In the case of Paper Replay when launched explicitly, the root level is the initial menu containing items such as Record New Session, Play Session, etc. The root level of the play Quick Command is the "Play Session" list of Paper Replay.



Turning On Your Smartpen

To use your smartpen, first turn it on. It must be running to capture written notes or enable its audio recording or playback features. See <u>Using the Paper Replay™ Application on page 69</u> for more information.

 Press the Power button to turn on your smartpen. As the smartpen starts up, the display shows the words Livescribe and then Starting... After start-up completes, the display shows the time.

Note: If you have given your smartpen a name using Livescribe Desktop, your smartpen will display its name when you power it on.

- The first time you use the smartpen, you must set it to the current time and date. See <u>Setting</u> the <u>Date on page 31</u> and <u>Setting the Time on</u> page 32 for more information.
- When you are finished using your smartpen, press the **Power** button again to turn it off.



Writing and Recording Audio

There are many features of your Livescribe smartpen. One of its primary uses is to capture notes and optionally record audio.

Capturing Notes without Audio

To use your Livescribe smartpen to capture notes without audio, follow these steps.

- 1. Power on your Livescribe smartpen by pressing the power button.
- 2. If needed, remove the smartpen cap. If you are using a new ink cartridge, you may need to remove possibly the small protective plastic coating from your ink cartridge tip. All new ink cartridges have this coating to prevent the ink from drying up.

3. Begin writing on any Livescribe[™] dot paper product, such as a Livescribe notebook, journal, or flip notepad. As long as the smartpen is on, it will capture your handwritten notes and drawings.

Capturing Notes with Audio

To use your Livescribe smartpen to capture notes and audio recordings follow these steps. For details about Paper Replay[™], see *Using the Paper Replay[™] Application on page 69*.

- 1. Power on your Livescribe smartpen by pressing the power button.
- 2. If needed, remove the smartpen cap. If you are using a new ink cartridge, you may need to remove possibly the small protective plastic coating from your ink cartridge tip. All new ink cartridges have this coating to prevent the ink from drying up.
- Start the Paper Replay[™] application to record audio as you write.

To start Paper Replay, tap on the **Record** button in any Livescribe[™] dot paper product, such as a Livescribe notebook, journal, or flip notepad. See. <u>Starting Recording with a Pre-Printed</u>
<u>Record button on page 70</u>

You can also launch the Paper ReplayTM application directly from the Nav Plus. See <u>Using the Nav Plus on page 46</u> for more information.

- 4. Begin writing on any Livescribe™ dot paper product. As long as the smartpen is on, it will capture any handwritten notes and drawings.
- 5. When you have finished taking notes and recording audio, tap on the **Stop** button in any notebook. Or, stop the Paper Replay[™] application with the Nav Plus.

Note: The Stop button ends the Paper Replay audio recording. If you are taking notes without recording Paper Replay audio, you do not need to use the Stop button.

6. Listen back to your recorded audio by tapping on your handwritten notes.

Recording Audio Only

You can use your smartpen to record audio only, without capturing notes. See <u>Recording Paperless</u> (<u>Audio Only</u>) <u>Sessions on page 79</u> for more information about this capability.

- 1. Power on your Livescribe smartpen by pressing the power button.
- Start the Paper Replay[™] application to record audio. To start Paper Replay audio recording, use one of the following methods:

 Use the Quick Record feature (see <u>Starting Recording Using Quick Record on page 70</u>). Press and hold the Power button for approximately five seconds until the display indicates that the recording started.



- Tap on the Record button in any Livescribe[™] dot paper product, such as a Livescribe notebook, journal, or flip notepad. See. <u>Starting Recording with a Pre-Printed Record button on page 70</u>
- Launch the Paper Replay[™] application directly from the Nav Plus. See <u>Using the Nav Plus on page 46</u> for more information.
- 3. When you have finished recording audio, tap on the **Stop** button in any notebook. Or, stop the Paper Replay™ application with the Nav Plus.

Charging an Echo™ Smartpen

The USB connector for an Echo™ smartpen is located on the top next to the headset jack. This is a standard micro USB connector that is compatible with any standard USB charging cable. Follow these steps to charge your smartpen

- Before charging your Echo[™] smartpen, download and install the Livescribe Desktop software from http://www.livescribe.com/install.
- Plug your Micro-USB cable into the USB port on your computer and plug the other end of the cable into your smartpen.

Note: You can also charge the Echo smartpen directly from an electrical outlet with the Universal USB AC Wall Adapter.



A battery and lightning bolt symbol will be displayed on your Livescribe smartpen when it is charging.

A full charge can take up to 2.5 hours. To determine if your Livescribe smartpen is fully charged, see <u>Viewing the Battery</u> <u>Level on page 36</u>.

TIP: The plug and blinking battery indicator means your Livescribe smartpen needs to be charged.





Charging a Pulse™ Smartpen

The USB connector for a Pulse smartpen is located on its side. The connector is designed to fit into a compatible Livescribe USB charging cradle. Follow these steps to charge your smartpen

- Before charging your Pulse[™] smartpen, download and install the Livescribe Desktop software from www.livescribe.com/install.
- 2. Plug your USB mobile charging cradle into the USB port on your computer. The smartpen will charge directly from your computer's USB port when the computer is on. The USB connection (located on the side of the Pulse smartpen) is designed to dock into the compatible Livescribe USB mobile charging cradle.

Note: You can also charge the Pulse smartpen directly from an electrical outlet with the Pro Charging Cradle or the Universal USB AC Wall Adapter.



3. Place the Pulse smartpen in your USB mobile charging cradle.

A battery and lightning bolt symbol will be displayed on your Livescribe smartpen when it is charging.

A full charge can take up to 2.5 hours. To determine if your Pulse™ smartpen is fully charged, see *Viewing the Battery Level on page 36*.





TIP: The plug and blinking battery indicator means your Pulse™ smartpen needs to be charged.



Replacing the Ink Cartridge or Stylus

To replace an ink cartridge, just use your fingers to grasp and pull out the old cartridge and insert a new one. If you own a Pulse smartpen and have a USB mobile charging cradle, you can instead use the cradle to help replace the cartridge as follows.

- 1. Insert the smartpen ink tip into the ink cartridge removal ring.
- 2. Tilt the smartpen so that it firmly rests against the removal ring and lift the smartpen away from the ring.
- 3. Lifting the smartpen away from the cradle will safely separate the ink cartridge from the magnet inside the smartpen that holds it in place.

4. Place your new ink cartridge in the smartpen. Before using the smartpen, be sure to remove the protective plastic coating from your ink cartridge tip. All new ink cartridges have this coating in place to prevent the ink from drying up.



Note: If you want to use the smartpen but do not want to make ink marks on your paper, purchase a stylus from the Livescribe web store. To insert the stylus, follow the steps above, but substitute the stylus for the replacement ink cartridge.

Using a 3-D Recording Headset

With your Livescribe smartpen, you can record audio with either the built-in microphone or a 3-D Recording Headset. Livescribe designed the built-in microphone for monaural recordings in smaller recording environments, such as a conference room. When recording in larger spaces, we recommend using a 3-D Recording Headset, which contains a microphone in each earbud. The dual microphones enable binaural recordings, which accurately recreate the spatial audio environment.

- 1. Left and right speakers
- 2. Left and right microphones



Binaural recording is a special type of stereo recording that uses two microphones, one placed in each ear. This type of recording provides the most accurate spatial sound quality because the microphones

effectively mimic your ears - when you play a binaural recording back, it sounds like you are actually in the location where you recorded.

Once you record audio, you can play back the binaural effect using stereo earphones. You can also play back the binaural effect as a regular stereo recording over any type of headphones or speakers.

The 3-D Recording Headset included with each Pulse smartpen has a custom jack. This is required for binaural recordings. However, if you want to use a 3.5mm stereo headset just for playback, connect your 3.5mm headset to your smartpen using a standard 2.5mm to 3.5mm adaptor.

If you own an Echo™ smartpen, you can use any standard 3.5mm stereo headset for playback. For binaural recording, you need to use a Livescribe 3.5mm 3-D Recording Premium Headset. You can purchase this separately from the Livescribe Online Store.

Note: You can record binaural audio with the earbuds in your ears or around your neck as shown below. Make sure the "L" earbud is in your left ear and the "R" earbud is in your right ear.



Note: Keep the earbuds about 6-8 inches apart to mimic the position of your ears.

Renaming Your Smartpen in Livescribe™ Desktop

Your smartpen has a default name. You can rename your Livescribe smartpen to identify it from other smartpens in Livescribe™ Desktop.

To rename your smartpen:

- 1. Install and Launch Livescribe™ Desktop. (See the Livescribe™ Desktop User Guide for details).
- 2. Dock the smartpen to be renamed.
- 3. If it is not already selected, use the smartpen selector drop down to choose the smartpen you want to rename.
- **4.** Choose **Tools > Smartpen > Rename**. At the prompt, type the smartpen name and click **OK**.

Rebooting Your Livescribe™ Smartpen

If for some reason your Livescribe smartpen is unresponsive, perform the following steps:

- Charge your smartpen using its cradle (for Pulse[™] smartpens) or Micro-USB cable (for Echo[™] smartpens) for at least five minutes. If your smartpen is still nonresponsive after five minutes of charging, you may need to reboot it.
- 2. To reboot your Livescribe smartpen, press and hold the power button for 10 seconds.

4 Configuring Your Livescribe™ Smartpen

You can configure the Livescribe smartpen to your own preferences. There are generally two ways to view current smartpen settings and optionally change them:

- Use printed buttons in the Status and Settings areas printed on the inside covers of Livescribe notebooks. <u>Using a Notebook's Settings and Status Buttons on page 30</u>
- Use the Settings menu on your smartpen. Using the Settings Menu on page 38

Note: You can also view and manage your smartpen content using Livescribe Desktop. For details, see the *Livescribe Desktop User Guide*.

From your smartpen, you can view and change the following settings:

Using a Notebook's Settings and Status Buttons

Livescribe notebooks provide printed buttons you can use to view and change settings. Some notebooks have more printed buttons than others for viewing and changing settings. Most notebooks include **Settings** and **Status** areas, with various printed buttons.



Using the **Settings** area printed buttons you can change some smartpen settings, including:

- Date and time
- Display brightness
- Scroll speed
- Display orientation
- Audio volume and mute

The **Status** area provides buttons you can use to view current smartpen information, including:

- Date and time
- Battery level
- Storage
- Audio settings
- Software version

Setting the Date

IMPORTANT: It is critical that you set the correct time and date on your smartpen because Paper Replay sessions you create with your smartpen are named using the time and date they are created. Also, the Livescribe smartpen presents the date format as mm/dd/yy by default. You can change this format either before or any time after you set the date. To change the date format, see <u>Setting/Viewing the Date Format on page 43</u>.

 With your smartpen turned on, open the inside cover of your notebook. Locate the **Settings** area.



2. Tap the **Set Date** button with the Livescribe smartpen.

3. Tap the printed keypad and type the current date.

Example: Tapping 101809 sets the date to Sunday, October 18, 2009 for the date format of mm/dd/yy.

Your smartpen will now display the date you entered.

NOTES:

- If you make a mistake while entering the date, simply tap on the Set Date buttons again to start over.
- To set the date format, see <u>Setting/</u> Viewing the Date Format on page 43.






Setting the Time

 With your smartpen turned on, open the inside cover of your notebook. Locate the **Settings** area.



- In your notebook, tap the Set Time button with the Livescribe smartpen.
- 3. Tap the printed **Settings** keypad and enter the time as "hh:mm" format. Tap the "AM" or "PM" button to select AM or PM. For example, to enter 12:01PM, tap "1," "2," "0," "1," and the "PM" button.



Your smartpen will now display the time you entered.

NOTES:

- If you make a mistake, entering the time, simply tap on the Set Time buttons again to start over.
- To set the time format, see <u>Setting/</u> Viewing the Time Format on page 43.

Setting Display Brightness

Tap the Display Brightness button on the inside covers of your notebook to select between brightness settings. Tap multiple times to scroll through the display brightness settings. Values are 100%, 90%, 75%, 50%, and 10%.

Note: The lowest brightness setting is optimal for dark room environments, such as when a speaker may be presenting a slideshow.

Alternatively, use the **Settings** menu on your smartpen to change the display brightness.

Setting the Display Orientation

You can configure your smartpen display for either left- or right-handed use. Tap the appropriate button to configure your display orientation. Alternatively, use the **Settings** menu on your smartpen to change the display orientation.

 With your smartpen turned on, open the inside cover of your notebook. Locate the **Settings** area.



Under Settings, tap on the Left or Right button to orient your display for left- or right-handed use.



Setting Scroll Speed of the Display

Text that is too long to fit on your smartpen display will scroll across the display. You can increase or decrease the rate at which text scrolls using the Scroll Speed settings.

- To increase the scroll speed, tap the button.
- To decrease the scroll speed, tap the printed button.
- Tap until you reach the desired speed, between 1 and 10.

You can also view and set scroll speed using the **Settings** menu. See <u>Setting/Viewing Scroll Speed on page 42</u>.

Viewing Playback Latency



To view the current playback latency setting, tap on the audio settings button settings on the inside cover of your notebook.

You can also view and set playback latency using the **Settings** menu. See <u>Setting/Viewing Playback</u> <u>Latency on page 42</u>. Or, view the current setting using a quick command. See <u>Viewing Audio Settings</u> <u>with a Quick Command on page 60</u>.

Viewing Audio (Recording) Quality Settings



To view the current audio (recording) quality, tap on the audio settings button settings on the inside cover of your notebook.

You can also view and set audio (recording) quality using the **Settings** menu. See <u>Setting/Viewing</u> <u>Audio (Recording) Quality on page 41</u>. Or, view the current setting using a quick command. See <u>Viewing Audio Settings with a Quick Command on page 60</u>.

Viewing Microphone Sensitivity Settings



To view the current microphone sensitivity, tap on the audio settings button on the inside cover of your notebook.

You can also view the microphone sensitivity setting using the **Settings** menu. See <u>Setting/Viewing</u> <u>Microphone Sensitivity on page 41</u>. Or, view the current setting using a quick command. See <u>Viewing</u> <u>Audio Settings with a Quick Command on page 60</u>.

Viewing the Date and Time

1. Tap the Time button to check the current time.

Viewing the Battery Level

1. Tap the Battery button to see the current battery charge. The indicator pictured shows a full battery.





Viewing Storage Available

 Tap the Storage button once to see amount of remaining storage in megabytes and tap a second time to see the remaining recording time based on the current audio (recording) quality settings.





Note: If available space is less than 1 MB, your smartpen will display memory in available KB.

IMPORTANT: If you see the circled exclamation mark indicator on the right side of the display, check your available memory on the Livescribe smartpen as it is almost full.



You can also view the available storage using a quick command. See <u>Viewing Available Storage with a Quick Command on page 61</u>.

Viewing the Software Version

Tap the Software version button to see the current version of software installed on your smartpen.





Setting/Viewing Audio (Recording) Quality

Use the Audio (Recording) quality setting to change the compression rate of the recorded AAC audio: the higher the audio quality, the lower the compression rate. As a result, files recorded with the highest audio quality setting will be larger files that require more storage space.

- Use High to record at the highest audio quality. This setting will require the largest amount of storage space and is optimal for very large environments or when the highest quality recording is required.
- Use Medium to return to the default recommended audio quality setting.
- Use Low to record at lowest audio quality. This is a memory-saving setting that will utilize the least amount of memory and is optimal for dictations or smaller quieter recording environments.

Note: You cannot change these settings during recording. Always select the appropriate audio quality setting before beginning a recording.

Setting/Viewing Microphone Sensitivity

You can set your smartpen microphone sensitivity for different recording situations.

- Use Conference Room to set the microphone sensitivity for quieter environments where the person speaking is closer to the microphone. This setting is optimal for dictations, offices, or small conference rooms.
- Use Lecture Hall to set the microphone to pick up sounds in a wider open area. This setting is optimal for large rooms where the speaker's voice is distant from your smartpen microphone. We also recommend the use of the 3-D Recording Headset when recording in this type of environment.
- Use Automatic to let your smartpen automatically set your microphone sensitivity based on the noise level of your environment. This is the recommended default setting for the Livescribe smartpen.

Note: You cannot change settings while your smartpen is recording. Always select the appropriate microphone setting before beginning a recording. The microphone will stay set at the last setting you used.

Setting/Viewing Playback Latency

When you tap your notes to play back a Paper Replay[™] session, the audio will play from a moment five seconds before the note was actually written. This allows you to more accurately replay the moment because there is natural delay between the time when you hear an important point and the time when you begin writing.

Set the Playback Latency to Off to turn off this latency. You will want to do this if you are playing back a recording in which your audio and writing are perfectly synchronized.

Enabling/Disabling the Menu Voice

Your smartpen voice audibly announces certain menu items, specifically items in the **Main Menu** and in Applications menu. Set Menu voice to Off to disable it.

Note: Turning off the Menu Voice will not affect Paper Replay[™] audio or other smartpen sounds.

Setting/Viewing Display Brightness

To change the brightness of your smartpen display, use the **Settings** menu. Values are 100%, 90%, 75%, 50%, and 10%.

Note: The lowest brightness setting is optimal for dark room environments, such as when a speaker may be presenting a slideshow.

Setting/Viewing Scroll Speed

To change the scroll speed of your smartpen display, use the **Settings** menu on your smartpen available through the Nav Plus. Values are 1-10. 1 is slowest and 10 is fastest.

Setting the Auto-Off Time

You smartpen has an auto-off feature to save power after long periods of inactivity. Using the **Auto-Off Time** option, you can set the length of time before your smartpen automatically powers off. You can set the auto-off time as 30 minutes, 1 hour (the default), 2 hours, and 4 hours.

To set the auto-off time, use the Nav Plus to go to **Settings** > **Auto-off Time**. Select the desired time and Tap right.

Note: The auto-off time setting persists until you change it or the smartpen is completely reset.

Setting/Viewing Display Orientation

To change the orientation of your smartpen display, use the **Settings** menu. Values are right-handed and left-handed.

Setting/Viewing the Date Format

To change the date format to "mm/dd/yy", "dd/mm/yy", or "yy/mm/dd":

Use the Settings menu and navigate to the Date Format option and select either mm/dd/yy, dd/mm/yy, or yy/mm/dd.

Setting/Viewing the Time Format

To change the time format between 12 hour and 24 hour:

• Use the **Settings** menu and navigate to the Time format option. Select either 12 hour or 24 hour.

Viewing the Smartpen Name

If you use Livescribe Desktop to name your smartpen, you can view its name when the smartpen starts up or at any time using the Nav Plus to go to **Settings** > **Smartpen Name**.

Switching Languages (Locales)

You can use the **Locale** command in the **Settings** menu to change your Livescribe smartpen display and audio instructions from one language to another. When you switch to another language, your smartpen will change these things based on the locale:

- Language of text resources (such as menus and other on-screen prompts)
- Language of audio resources (such as application names and instructions)
- Date format
- Time format
- Number format

Livescribe also provides printed controls to switch between languages. See <u>Using the Language</u> <u>Switch Card for Chinese and Korean on page 44</u> and <u>Using the Getting Started Guide Controls to Switch Locales on page 45</u>.

To use the **Locale** command in the **Settings** menu:

- Use the Settings menu and navigate to the Locale option. Select one of the available locales. This list includes:
- English
- Français
- Español
- Deutsch
- Italiano
- Chinese
- Korean
- 2. When prompted, tap right again to restart your smartpen. After your smartpen restarts, it will run with the selected language as the default.

Using the Language Switch Card for Chinese and Korean

You can use the Language Switch Card to switch your Livescribe smartpen from English to Chinese or Korean.



For example, to switch from English to Korean:



- 1. Tap the Korean button
- 2. Tap the button again to restart your smartpen. After your smartpen restarts, it will run with Korean as the default locale.

Using the Getting Started Guide Controls to Switch Locales

The *Getting Started Guide* that ships with your Livescribe smartpen *may* have printed controls to switch your smartpen from English to other languages. If it does, you can use these controls as follows. Otherwise, use the Settings menu to switch locales:

For example, to switch from English to German:

- 1. Tap the Deutsch button
- DEUTSCH TIPPEN SIE HIER
- 2. Tap the button again to restart your smartpen. After your smartpen restarts, it will run with German as the default locale.


5 Navigating the Main Menu

You can use the **Main Menu** of the Livescribe smartpen to locate applications and settings for the Livescribe smartpen. This topic describes how to navigate around the **Main Menu** and use other techniques to quickly get to applications and information you want. Topics covered include:

Using the Nav Plus

The Nav Plus is a paper-based, five-way navigator that enables you to navigate through your smartpen **Main Menu** and application menus.



Using a Pre-Printed Nav Plus

You can use any Nav Plus you see printed on any Livescribe™ dot paper product, such as the included notebook. To use a printed Nav Plus:

1. Double-tap the center of the Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

Note: Double-tapping on the center of a Nav Plus will exit the current application or sub-menu and take you to the Main Menu. The one exception to this rule is that if you are recording using the Paper Replay™ application, double-tapping the center will take you to the Main Menu but background recording will continue.

- Main Menu will be displayed on the Livescribe smartpen.
- Tap down on the directional arrow of the Nav Plus to scroll through a list of applications on the Livescribe smartpen.

4. When the desired application name is displayed, tap right to select that application.

5. Tap down to scroll through the application menu.



6. Tap right to select an item in the application menu list.



7. Tap left to return to the previous menu.



8. To return to the **Main Menu**, tap a series of left taps or double-tap on the center of the Nav Plus to jump to the **Main Menu**.


Note: The Livescribe smartpen will display small directional arrows to indicate the directions in the menu that you can scroll through.

Drawing a Nav Plus

If a pre-printed Nav Plus is not easily accessible, create your own simply by drawing one.

To draw a Nav Plus:

 Using any Livescribe[™] dot paper product, such as the included Starter notebook, draw intersecting vertical and horizontal lines. You can draw the intersecting lines in either order. The lines should:




- Be approximately the same length
- Intersect near their centers
- WIthin one second of drawing the lines, double-tap in the center of the Nav Plus. This will complete the process of creating a Nav Plus.

Note: After you draw a Nav Plus, it is always usable for future use.

Main Menu is displayed on your smartpen when you have successfully created a Nav Plus.







Nav Pluses drawn incorrectly:

Lines are not straight.




Lines do not intersect in the center of each line.



Scrolling with Flick and Scrub

Flick and Scrub is a way for you to quickly scroll through menu items and other displayed text on your smartpen. This feature is useful when text presented by an application is longer than the display can show horizontally or when multiple menus or options are available vertically.

Flicking refers to quickly dragging your smartpen across paper and then lifting your smartpen off the paper. The contents of the display scrolls rapidly, based on the speed of your smartpen when it was lifted.



Scrubbing refers to dragging your smartpen across the paper. The contents on the display moves and scrolls in the same direction and at the same relative speed as the movement of your smartpen.




To use Flick and Scrub scrolling:

- 1. Navigate to a list of vertical menu items, such as Main Menu or one of its submenus, such as Applications or Settings.
- 1. On any unused paper region, press the tip of your smartpen down for one-half (1/2) second.
- 2. Wait until you hear a short beep, then without lifting your smartpen tip off the paper, draw a horizontal or vertical line.

Your smartpen assigns the area you draw as a Flick and Scrub control area for any application.

TIP: Instead of drawing a line, you can draw a rectangular box as the Flick and Scrub control area. You may find the box easier to use because it provides a wider area than a straight line.





Move your smartpen on the flick and scrub control area you drew to scroll through the application's display text.

The display text will scroll either up and down (for vertical controls) or left and right (for horizontal controls), depending on the direction in which you drew the control.

Note: You can use both flicking and scrubbing motions on the same control area. You do not need to draw a separate area for flicking and another for scrubbing. However, you will need separate control areas for vertical and horizontal scrolling.

TIP: After you have created a Flick and Scrub control region, you can use it at any time for scrolling. This is similar to the way you can reuse a hand-drawn Nav Plus after creating it. To return to use the Flick and Scrub region you do not need to press down the smartpen tip again for 1/2 a second. This is only needed when first creating the region.



Flick and Scrub Display Indicators

When using Flick and Scrub, the display shows indicators based on the direction of additional text and the relative position of the displayed text to the contents.

Vertical Flick and Scrub Scroll Indicator. For vertical Flick and Scrub, the scroll indicator is on the right side of the display. In this example, the text shown is close to the top of the current menu list. Therefore, the vertical scroll indicator is near the top.



Horizontal Flick and Scrub Scroll Indicator. For horizontal Flick and Scrub, the scroll indicator is at the bottom. In the examples below, the display scrolls through the phrase "there were two small

children". The scroll bar along the bottom shows how far through the phrase the current display is. The first display shows the position near the beginning of the phrase.



The second display shows the scroll bar position near the middle of the phrase after scrolling the display horizontally.



Using Quick Commands

Quick Commands let you write a one-line command with the Livescribe smartpen and get an immediate response on your smartpen display. Quick Commands are useful when you do not have access to the **Status** buttons on the inside cover of your Livescribe notebooks, or if you need to do a quick calculation while writing.

The following is a list of Quick Commands available on the Livescribe smartpen.

Note: Quick Commands are not case sensitive.

- Launch an application. See <u>Launching Applications with a Quick Command on page 54</u>.
- Show the top session in the Paper Replay™ "Play Session" list. See <u>Locating and Playing a Recent</u> Session with a Quick Command on page 56.
- Write and solve a quick calculation. See <u>Doing Basic Math Calculations with a Quick Command on page 58</u>.
- Show available battery power. See <u>Viewing the Battery Level with a Quick Command on page 63</u>.
- Show your audio (recording) quality settings. See <u>Viewing Audio Settings with a Quick Command</u> on page 60".
- Show your remaining smartpen storage. See <u>Viewing Available Storage with a Quick Command on page 61</u>.

Show the current time or date. See Viewing the Time and Date with Quick Commands on page 65.

Launching Applications with a Quick Command

Quick Launch is a Quick Command you can use to start smartpen applications. You can use Quick Launch to start any applications available in the **Main Menu** and other folders within it.


Note: You can write Quick Launch commands in your native language for certain Livescribe smartpen applications. For example, a German user can launch Piano by creating a Quick Launch command named Klavier.

 Double-tap on the center of a Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.


double-tap center



Your smartpen displays the Quick Command indicator (asterisk) in the Main Menu. It is waiting for you to write a Quick Command.



3. Within three (3) seconds, write the first few letters of the application you want to launch. For example, writing "Pi" would scroll your display to the Piano application. Writing the letters "Pa" would scroll to Paper Replay. Writing the letter P, would scroll to the first application that begins with the letter P. From there, you can scroll to the specific application you want to start using the Nav Plus or Flick and Scrub. See Scrolling with Flick and Scrub on page 50 for more information.



Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first application that matches your written input. As soon as you see the application you want on the display, you can stop writing.


4. Tap right on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.



5. Your smartpen will leave Quick Launch and start the application.



TIP: Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command. That is, you can re-launch the application at any time by tapping your Quick Command.



Locating and Playing a Recent Session with a Quick Command

Use the Play Quick Command to get fast access to your saved Paper Replay™ sessions. To quickly show the top item in your "Play Session" list:

1. Double-tap on the center of a Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

double-tap center



Your smartpen will display the Quick Command indicator in the **Main Menu**. It is waiting for you to write a Quick Command.



Within three (3) seconds, write the word "play."



Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input. In this case, "play" is displayed as soon as you write "p". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.

Right-tap on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.







- Your smartpen will display the top item in the Play session list. You can tap down using the Nav Plus to scroll through sessions and then tap right to begin playback.
- Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command.





Doing Basic Math Calculations with a Quick Command

You can use the Calc Quick Command to perform basic mathematical calculations.

 Double-tap the center of a Nav Plus. A doubletap is two taps in quick succession.

double-tap center



Main Menu

- Your smartpen will display the Quick Command indicator in the **Main Menu**. It is waiting for you to write a Quick Command.
- 3. Within three (3) seconds, write the word "calc."



Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input In this case, calc is displayed as soon as you write a "c". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.

4. Right-tap on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.







5. Your smartpen will prompt you to write a problem.



6. Write a basic math problem, such as 51 x 3 =



7. Your smartpen will display the result.



Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command.



Guidelines for Writing a Math Problem:

- Numbers can contain up to 12 characters, including a decimal point.
- Operators can include +, -, x, *, /, and ÷.
- You can double-tap instead of writing the equals sign.

Example: 52 - 14 followed by a double-tap is an accepted entry.

Note: If the length of the math problem exceeds the display size, the beginning of the problem scrolls off the left of the display as new characters are added to the right.

- 3. Within three (3) seconds, write the word "audio."




Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input. In this case, audio is displayed as soon as you write "a". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.





4. Right-tap on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.



5. Your smartpen will display its audio settings.



Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command.



Viewing Available Storage with a Quick Command

To display the amount of available memory on the Livescribe smartpen:

1. Double-tap on the center of a Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

double-tap center



- Your smartpen will display the Quick Command indicator in the **Main Menu**. It is waiting for you to write a Quick Command.
- 3. Within three (3) seconds, write the word "storage."



Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input In this case, storage is displayed as soon as you write an "s". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.

Right-tap on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.









5. Your smartpen will display the available memory.

Notes:

- If available space is less than 1 MB, your smartpen will display memory in available KB.
- If you see the circled exclamation mark indicator on the right side of the display, check your available memory on the Livescribe smartpen as it is almost full.

Viewing the Battery Level with a Quick Command

To view the current battery level of your Livescribe smartpen:

1. Double-tap on the center of a Nav Plus. A double-tap is two taps in quick succession.

- Your smartpen displays the Quick Command indicator (asterisk) in the Main Menu. It is waiting for you to write a Quick Command.
- 3. Within three (3) seconds, write the word "battery."



Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input In this case, battery is displayed as soon as you write a "b". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.

4. Right-tap on the Nav Plus, or double-tap on any open paper.









- 5. Your smartpen will display the remaining battery power.
- 6. Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command.





Viewing the Time and Date with Quick Commands

You can use Quick Commands to check the time or date. Or, you can check the current Time and Date

by tapping on the printed Time under Status.









Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input. In this case, date or time is displayed as soon as you write a "d" or "t". As soon as you see the command you want on the display, you can stop writing.







5. Your smartpen will display the date or time.



Once you have written a Quick Command, you can tap where you wrote it to repeat the command.



Launch Line and Tap Around

Using Launch Line is similar to Quick Launch. You can use Launch Line to quickly launch any Open Paper application installed on your smartpen. Open Paper applications are applications that do not require pre-printed paper controls to function. Examples of these applications are Piano, Translator Demo, and most applications on the Livescribe Online Store.

Tap around is a feature of Launch Line that is an alternative to using the Nav Plus to navigate menus of an application. The areas immediately surrounding a Launch Line function as the Nav Plus controls: Tap Up, Tap Down, Tap Left, Tap Right, and Tap Center.

The tap-around regions correspond to the features and regions of the Nav Plus, except that:

- Tap around controls menus and navigation within its corresponding application only.
- You cannot use tap around controls to launch other applications.


To create and use Launch Line and tap around:

- Draw a horizontal line on your notebook (starting from right or left) and without removing your smartpen tip from the page, immediately double back on the line ending close to where you started.
- Immediately write the name of the target application above the line.


Note: Using its predictive text feature, your smartpen will display the first command that matches your written input.

3. To launch an application, tap on the application name you have written.

Note: If the text you write is a unique match to an application, the application will launch automatically.



After creating a Launch Line, it remains as an active "button" that you can tap at any time to launch the application.







6 Using the Paper Replay™ Application

With the Paper Replay[™] application, your smartpen records audio and links it to what you write. Later, you can tap on any of your notes and hear the audio recorded from that moment.

Whenever you turn on the Livescribe smartpen, it captures a digital copy of your notes, whether or not you also choose to record audio.

The Paper Replay™ control bar printed at the bottom of every notebook page lets you begin and end a recording as well as manipulate the playback of your recording.

Note: The Paper Replay[™] printed controls are not page-specific. You can tap Record on one page, begin recording, and then tap Stop on a different page and the Livescribe smartpen will stop recording.

About Paper Replay™ Sessions

When you begin recording with the Livescribe smartpen, your smartpen automatically links the audio to anything you write on Livescribe™ dot paper. The recorded audio (and any associated written notes) is called a *Paper Replay™* session. A session begins when you start recording audio and ends when you stop recording audio. A paused recording is still one session. A session always contains audio and optionally can contain associated written notes (pages).

A session can be any length of time and does not necessarily equal a single page. For example, if you start and stop recording multiple times per page, you will have multiple Paper Replay[™] sessions on one page. Conversely, you may also have one Paper Replay[™] session that spans multiple pages.

The Paper Replay[™] playback controls such as jump, position bar, and bookmark, function within a single Paper Replay[™] session. You can jump forward or back or speed listen to only one Paper Replay[™] session at a time. If you created multiple Paper Replay[™] sessions on one page, you will need to tap on the notes associated with the specific desired recording to begin playback. After starting playback, you can then use the playback or bookmark controls to listen to that session.

When you tap on the playback controls before tapping on any of the written notes on a page, **your most recently accessed audio recording will play back** regardless of whether that recording or those notes are on the current page. This feature allows you to quickly replay your last recording even if you have forgotten to write notes on paper.

Recording Sessions

IMPORTANT: Do not record without permission. By using Livescribe products and services, you agree to comply with all laws regarding recording.

There are three ways to begin recording audio with the Livescribe smartpen:

- Starting Recording with a Pre-Printed Record button on page 70.
- Starting Recording Using Quick Record on page 70
- Starting Recording Using a Nav Plus on page 71

TIP: While you are recording with Paper Replay, you can use the Nav Plus to perform any normal set of functions, such as scrolling through the menus and launching applications.

Starting Recording with a Pre-Printed Record button

- 1. Tap the Record button on the bottom of your notebook with the tip of your smartpen.
- 2. While your smartpen is recording, you will see an incrementing timer on your display.



Note: After you initiate a recording, you can use other applications on the Livescribe smartpen, such as the Calculator. A blinking Record icon will appear in the bottom right corner of your display to indicate that recording is still in progress. To learn more, see <u>Using Background Recording on page 86</u>.

Starting Recording Using Quick Record

1. Press the Power button to turn on your smartpen.

Press and hold the Power button for approximately five seconds until the display indicates that the recording started.



Note: If your smartpen is off, press and hold the Power button until the start sequence and the word "REC…" appear on the display. Also, if you write on Livescribe™ dot paper after starting recording with Quick Record, your smartpen will link your notes and audio.

Stopping a Recording or a Session Playback

There are three ways to stop recording or playback of a session:

- Tap the Stop button on the bottom of your notebook.
- Turn Power off.
- Use the Nav Plus label to stop recording.
- During recording, single-tap the center of the Nav Plus. Your smartpen will display Stop Session.


Pausing/Resuming a Recording or Session Playback

You can suspend recording or audio playback of a session with the Pause button printed on the bottom of each notebook page. To resume recording or playback, simply tap Pause a second time. While your smartpen is paused, a pause icon will appear on the display.

While your smartpen is paused, it will continue to capture a copy of your digital notes. Any notes that you write after you tap pause are linked to the audio that occurred the moment before you tapped Pause. When you tap on notes that were written while paused, your smartpen will play back the recording from the moment just before you tapped Pause.

Playing a Session

There are three ways to play back a session:

Play a Session by Tapping on Your Notes


Tap any note of the notes you wrote while you recorded using the Paper Replay[™] application. The recorded audio will play back from the moment the notes were taken. During playback, your smartpen display will indicate the current position in the recording and the time remaining in your recording.



TIP: As you record, remember to write something down on your notepad so that you can begin playback by tapping on those notes. If you do not do this, you can instead browse a list of audio sessions stored on your smartpen with the Nav Plus.

Play a Session by Tapping on Notebook Buttons

Tap on any of the following printed buttons in your notebook to access the most recently recorded or played back session.



Play a Session using the Nav Plus

Use the Nav Plus to browse a list of audio sessions and select the audio file by timestamp:

1. Double-tap the center of the Nav Plus to reach your smartpen **Main Menu**.



2. Tap down until Paper Replay™is displayed.

Controlling Session Playback

There are various ways that you can control the playback of an audio file on your smartpen and quickly locate any section of the audio file. All of the controls mentioned below are available on the bottom of each page of your notebook.

Changing Playback Volume

Use the Volume controls to raise or lower the playback volume or mute playback entirely. After muting the playback, you can un-mute it by tapping the mute button a second time.

Jumping Forward and Backward

You can jump back or forward 10 seconds in an audio file by tapping on the Jump controls



Speed Jumping

Tap and hold down the Jump Back or Jump Forward button to continuously jump through an audio file. As you continue to speed jump, the length you jump increases.

Jumping to a Position

If you want to quickly jump to the beginning, end, or any position within an audio session, use the Jump to Position bar.



- Tap anywhere on the position bar to jump to the corresponding position in the audio file.
- Tap the 0% button to jump directly to the beginning of the current audio session.

Changing Playback Speed

- To slow down the audio from normal speed, tap the Slow Down Audio button. Tap repeatedly
 to keep slowing down audio speed.
- To speed up the audio from normal speed, tap the Speed Up Audio button. Tap repeatedly to keep increasing the playback speed.
- To return to normal speed—the speed at which the audio was recorded—tap the Normal Audio Speed button.

Note: Audio that is played back either sped up or slowed down is no longer in stereo. Audio plays in mono until it is returned to normal speed.

Setting Session Bookmarks

Bookmarks allow you to flag a section of audio and later jump to it quickly and easily. You can add bookmarks as you record, or add them later when listening to your recording.

Adding Bookmarks

 Tap the Bookmark button during either recording or playback. A bookmark will be placed at that point in the audio file.




Reviewing Bookmarks

After you have added bookmarks to an audio session, you can scan through the bookmarks using the



During playback, your smartpen display will indicate the bookmarks in the audio timeline.



Recording Paperless (Audio Only) Sessions

If you want to record audio but cannot or do not want to write on Livescribe[™] dot paper, you can create a *paperless* or *pageless* Paper Replay[™] session.

NOTES:

- When recording a paperless session, you can at any time, link the recording to written notes by writing on Livescribe[™] dot paper. At that point, the paperless session will be associated with your notes and will no longer be paperless.
- Similarly, if you have previously recorded a paperless session, you can play it back and begin writing on Livescribe[™] dot paper. The paperless session will be associated with your notes and will no longer be paperless. See <u>Annotating Linking Notes to Pre-Recorded Sessions on page 80</u>.

To create a paperless session, begin recording audio but do not take any notes. You can start a paperless session in various ways:

- Tapping the Record button on any notebook (see <u>Starting Recording with a Pre-Printed Record button on page 70</u>)
- Using the Quick Record feature (see <u>Starting Recording Using Quick Record on page 70</u>).
- Using the Nav Plus (see <u>Starting Recording Using a Nav Plus on page 71</u>

The new paperless session will appear in the Paper Replay™ session list.

To access a paperless session, use the Nav Plus to browse Paper Replay[™] sessions stored on the Livescribe smartpen. Your smartpen indicates a paperless session with an asterisk (*) next to the filename in the Select Session list.



Note: If recording the paperless session was the last action you took with the Livescribe smartpen, you can also access the session by tapping on the 0% point of the paper control position bar.

Annotating - Linking Notes to Pre-Recorded Sessions

You can write new notes and link them to a previously recorded audio file by writing on dot paper while you play back the audio recording. Your recorded audio can be already linked to your notes, or paperless (see <u>Recording Paperless (Audio Only) Sessions on page 79</u>). This feature is very useful when you need to clarify or expand on your notes later. For example, you may need to go back to your notes to correct or clarify a point made in a meeting or lecture. Those written corrections are linked to your original recorded audio.

To link notes to previously-recorded audio:

- 1. Start audio playback by tapping on your partially written notes or using Nav Plus to play a previously-recorded session.
- 2. After you start playback, begin writing with the Livescribe smartpen. Your smartpen automatically links your new notes to your previously recorded audio.
- Stop playback.
- 4. Tap on your newly written notes to play back the audio that you linked while writing the new notes.

Browsing Paper Replay™ Sessions

1. Double-tap the center of the Nav Plus to go to the **Main Menu**.



Paper Replay[™] sessions are named based on the time and date they are created. For example, if a session is started on June 03, 2008, at 12:22PM, it will be named and displayed as 06.03.08 12:22p.

Note: Your smartpen displays Paper Replay™ sessions in the order of the most recent with paperless sessions coming before regular sessions.

Tap right to select the session you want to play.







Deleting Paper Replay[™] Sessions

If you wish to delete sessions from your smartpen for any reason, such as managing storage, we recommend that you transfer your notes to Livescribe Desktop and then delete Paper Replay™ sessions from your smartpen.

When you delete a session from the Livescribe smartpen, your paper notes associated with that file will no longer play back the Paper Replay[™] audio that was associated with that ink. However, as long as you have transferred your notes to Livescribe Desktop, you can continue to replay your notes from your computer.

Note: You cannot retrieve a session after you delete it from both the Livescribe smartpen and Livescribe Desktop. Deleting sessions does not affect the notes on the Livescribe smartpen - they will remain on the Livescribe smartpen until you archive the notebook. To learn how to archive a paper product, see the Livescribe™ Desktop User Guide located in the Livescribe Desktop Help.

There are various ways to delete Paper Replay™ sessions from the Livescribe smartpen:

- Using the Windows Livescribe Desktop 'Remove Session from Smartpen' option or using the Mac Livescribe Desktop 'Remove Recordings from Smartpen...' option. For more information see Managing your Smartpen in the Livescribe™ Desktop User Guide.
- Archiving your notebook, journal, or other paper product to remove all Paper Replay[™] sessions from your smartpen for that paper product. See the *Managing your Smartpen* in the *Livescribe*[™] Desktop User Guide for more information.
- Using the Main Menu on the Livescribe smartpen. See <u>Deleting Sessions from the Smartpen Main</u> Menu on page 83.
- Using the Delete Current Session shortcut to delete the most-recently accessed session. See <u>Using the Delete Current Session Shortcut on page 86</u>.

Deleting Sessions from the Smartpen Main Menu






Using the Delete Current Session Shortcut

You can use a shortcut to delete the current session. In this context, the current session is the most recently accessed session. This is the last session that was either played or recorded.

To activate the Delete Current Session shortcut:

:

- 1. On any Paper Replay **Stop** button, tap and hold for three seconds. Your smartpen will instruct you to tap again to delete the current session.
- Tap Stop again to confirm the deletion.



Using Background Recording

With background recording, you can launch and run another Livescribe smartpen application (such as a calculator) while continuing to run Paper ReplayTM. Paper ReplayTM will continue audio recording in the background However, your smartpen *will not link* your notes to the audio while the other application is running. This is because the new application receives your smartpen input (ink and strokes). The newly-launched application has the focus of the Livescribe smartpen, and has control of your display and audio output.

If you want to stop or pause recording, or add new index points to your recording, you must reactivate Paper Replay[™] as the dominant application. There are several ways to make the Paper Replay[™] application reactivate (also known as snap back) to receive input from the Livescribe smartpen:

 Tap on any of the printed Paper Replay[™] controls, or on any Paper Replay[™] notes you have written.

- Do anything that would normally launch Paper Replay, such as tap in a session region or launch the Paper Replay™ application using the Nav Plus.
- Do not write or tap anything with your smartpen for five seconds.

Your smartpen display will indicate background recording is in effect with a blinking recording dot in the lower right-hand corner of your display.



IMPORTANT: TURNING OFF OR DOCKING YOUR SMARTPEN WILL STOP RECORDING.

Paper Replay Password

You can use Paper Replay Password to set a password for your Paper Replay sessions. Setting a password can prevent others from listening to your recorded audio on your smartpen. When Paper Replay is protected, audio play back is prevented until the password is entered. The password is a four-digit number.

To use Paper Replay Password:


- 1. From the **Main Menu**, Tap down to locate Paper Replay.
- 2. Tap right to launch Paper Replay.
- 3. Tap down to Password protection.
- 4. Tap right to set your password.





- 5. On your notepad, write four digits as your password. To disguise your written password, Livescribe recommends using one of these methods:
 - Write the numbers in a different order, for example backwards.
 - Write the numbers in various places on the page.
 - After writing and confirming your password, go back and write other numbers over your password to disguise it.





When you are finished entering your password, tap right on the Nav Plus. Your smartpen will confirm the password is set.



7. After setting your password, your smartpen will prompt you each time you try to play back a session. To listen to your sessions, write your password on your notebook when prompted by your smartpen. You smartpen will confirm if your password is correct.

Canceling Paper Replay Password


To cancel Paper Replay password and erase your password:

 Use the Nav Plus to navigate to the Paper Replay > Password protection > Remove password.



- 2. Tap right on the Nav Plus to remove the password and cancel password protection.
- At the prompt, write the current password to be removed.

Note: Passwords are not saved when password protection is turned off. The previous password is permanently erased. When you reactivate password protection, you will need to set a new password. You can re-use passwords. They are not tracked across uses.



4. Your smartpen will confirm the password is removed.



Note: You can also cancel password protection and remove your Paper Replay password using Livescribe Desktop. This is useful if you forget your password and need to regain access to your Paper Replay sessions. The Livescribe Desktop you use to cancel the password must be registered to the same account as your smartpen. You must dock your smartpen as well to remove the password. See the *Livescribe Desktop User Guide* for instructions.

Using the Printed Calculator

The calculator located on the inside covers of your notebook performs basic math functions, as well as many useful scientific functions. To use the calculator, tap on the printed keys with the tip of the Livescribe smartpen.



Note: A stylus is available for purchase from the Livescribe web store. Use the stylus instead of an ink cartridge to keep your calculator free and clear of ink marks. For information on using the stylus, please see *Using a 3-D Recording Headset on page 26*.

Basic Math Functions

The calculator displays results and accepts input of numbers up to a length of 11 characters. If a result

is longer than 11 digits, the calculator displays it in exponential notation. You can tap on the toggle between positive and negative numbers.

Using Basic Math Operators

Basic math operators function like a typical desk calculator. Tap a number, an operator, another number, and an equal sign to see the answer displayed.

If you tap the equal sign directly after the operator, the calculator performs the operation on the initial number that you tapped.

Example: Tap '6 x ='. The displayed result is 36.

If you tap more than one operator in a row, only the last operator is kept.

Example: Tap '6 x + 4 ='. The result is 10. The '+' replaces the 'x'.

If you tap the equal sign repeatedly in succession, it will repeat the previous calculation.

Example: Tap '3 + 4 = =' The initial result is 7. Then, 4 is added to 7 equaling 11.

Using Parentheses in Expressions

Normally the calculator respects the standard order of operations in an extended expression. However, you can use parentheses in an expression to control the sequence of execution. You can nest parentheses in order to further control of the calculation sequence. Each time you tap a close parenthesis, the calculator calculates and displays the result of the enclosed expression.

Using Clear Entry (CE) and Clear (C) Keys

Tap the key to clear the current entry. Tap the key to clear an entire expression, including any pending operator. Neither key clears values in memory.

Using Memory Keys

You can store numbers in the memory register. When a value is present in memory an M indicator appears. When the value in memory changes, the indicator on your smartpen display blinks. When the value in memory is zero, the memory indicator disappears.

Adds the currently displayed value to the value in the memory register.

Subtracts the currently displayed value from the value in the memory register.

Displays the value currently in the memory register.

Sets the memory value to "0".

Using Scientific Functions

The Scientific section of the calculator includes several specialized operators and functions.

Using Special Math Operators

number followed by one of these keys, the result is displayed immediately. Example: To square 7, tap '7 . The result is 49.

You can use the key to raise a number y to the power of a number x. Example: Tap raise 2 to the power of 3, tap '2 3 ='. The result is 8.

You can use the Rnd key to generate a random number between 0 and 1.

Using Trigonometry Functions

Trigonometric calculations such as sine, cosine, and tangent must be made in degree, radian, or gradian mode. The calculator is in degree mode by default, and returns to degree each time you turn off your smartpen.

The key toggles between degree, radian and gradian mode. If you use a trigonometry

function, or use the key to change modes, an indicator of the current mode will appear.

Note: You cannot use the key to convert a completed calculation. Use it to set the mode before beginning the calculation.

Using the Translator Demo

With the Translator Demo, you can translate a small set of words and the numbers zero to nine from English into Spanish, Swedish, Arabic, or Mandarin. By writing a word in English in your notebook, you can see and hear correct translation from the Livescribe smartpen.

Translator Demo Word List

Here are the words currently defined for the Translator Demo:

Zero, One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine, Ten

- Hello, Goodbye
- Please, Thanks, Thank you
- Chocolate, Banana
- Water, Coffee, Beer

- Tap on the word to see and hear the translation.

Re-Launching Translator Demo

Once you write a word in the Translator Demo, the word you wrote becomes an active "button". You can tap on this word at any time to launch Translator Demo. When launched, the Translator Demo will translate that word again into any of the Translator Demo languages.

Note: You can also re-launch Translator Demo using Quick Launch (see <u>Using Quick Commands on page 53</u>) or Launch Line (see <u>Launch Line and Tap Around on page 67</u>).

 Tap on the word button you created when you launched the Translator Demo.



Tap down to scroll through available languages.







3. Tap right to select a language.

Note: When your smartpen displays a language on its display, the translator demo is automatically switched into that mode, whether or not you tap right.

Using the Piano

With Piano, you can draw a piano on your dotted paper and play music with the Livescribe smartpen. You can change the sound of your piano, add rhythm tracks, and add sharp and flat notes.

Launching Piano from the Nav Plus

Note: You can also launch Piano using Quick Launch (see <u>Using Quick Commands on page 53</u>) or Launch Line (see <u>Launch Line and Tap Around on page 67</u>).


Tap the "i" button repeatedly to select one of the seven instruments: Grand Piano, Vibraphone, Kalimba, Steel Drum, Fiddle, Flute, or Celeste.

Tap on your keyboard when the first letter of the instrument you want to play is displayed on the Livescribe smartpen display.





- 7. Write the letter "r" and double-tap near it. This is your rhythm tracks button.
- **8.** Tap the "r" button repeatedly to scroll through the five rhythm track options.



Next, add sharps and flats to your piano keyboard. After setting the instrument and rhythm buttons, tap left on the Nav Plus. The Livescribe will display Rhythms OFF.

10. Tap down to reach Add Sharps & Flats.





12. The Livescribe will display blinking rectangles on your piano. Draw rectangles after the 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 6th, and 7th piano key lines, as in the display.





13. Play your piano by tapping its keys on the paper. Tap the instrument and rhythm buttons to change their values. See Choosing an Instrument (Plano Sound) on page 102 and Choosing a Background Rhythm Track on page 102.



Note: A stylus is available for purchase from the Livescribe web store. You can use the stylus on your piano, rather than the ink cartridge. This will keep the paper free and clear of ink marks. For information on using the stylus please see *Using a 3-D Recording Headset on page 26*.


Choosing an Instrument (Plano Sound)

- 1. Tap your "i" instrument button repeatedly to scroll through the instrument sounds your piano can play. Available sounds are:
 - Grand Piano
 - Vibraphone
 - Kalimba
 - Steel Drum
 - Fiddle, Flute
 - Celeste
- Tap on your piano keyboard to select a sound. The first letter of the instrument you want to play shows on the Livescribe smartpen display.



Choosing a Background Rhythm Track

 Tap the "r" rhythm track button repeatedly to scroll through the available background rhythm tracks.




Turning Off the Rhythm Track


There are two ways to turn off the rhythm track:

Getting New Applications

Livescribe and other companies offer new applications for your Livescribe smartpen. You can download these from the Livescribe Online Store. Just go to www.livescribe.com/store and browse the applications available. Some applications are free and others are available for purchase. These applications are designed to work like the built-in applications that come with your Livescribe smartpen. Visit the store regularly to check for new updates.

After you download a new application, you can use Livescribe™ Desktop and add it to any Livescribe smartpen registered to your Livescribe account.

All applications are installed through Livescribe Desktop. Livescribe Desktop installs downloaded applications to your smartpen under a new **Applications** menu. This menu is the first menu item underneath the **Main Menu** and is available after you install your first downloaded application. For more information on how to purchase, download, and install applications, refer to the *Livescribe Desktop User Guide*.

To launch a purchased application on your smartpen:

1. Double-tap the center of a Nav Plus to get to the **Main Menu**.

Livescribe TM Desktop is software you install on your computer to store and access the Livescribe smartpen content. With Livescribe Desktop you can search and review your written notes and listen to your recorded audio. You can also export your notes and recorded audio and save them as Pencasts and save them as files on your computer to share with others. Livescribe Desktop also installs smartpen updates and applications to your smartpen. To learn more about Livescribe Desktop, see the Livescribe TM Desktop User Guide available under the Livescribe Desktop Help menu.

About Livescribe™ Online

Livescribe™ Online is your connection to your personal web space and profile at livescribe.com. You can upload copies of your notes and recorded audio as Pencasts to Livescribe Online to share with others. You can also use Livescribe Online to manage your personal myLivescribe space and access the Livescribe Online Store. From the store, you can purchase Livescribe smartpens, notebooks, and accessories. You can also purchase additional applications for your Livescribe smartpen. 9 Working with Dot Paper Products

Livescribe prints notebooks, journals, flip notepads, and other Livescribe™ dot paper products for your Livescribe smartpen. There is nothing special about the composition of the paper used for Livescribe™ dot paper products. However, each page of Livescribe™ dot paper is printed with thousands of nearly-invisible microdots arranged in a special pattern. Your Livescribe smartpen reads these dots to determine which page you are using and where on that page you are tapping or writing. With this information, your smartpen can capture your notes, link audio to them, and perform other paper-based operations.

LivescribeTM dot paper products sometimes re-use dot pattern. As a general rule, *do not use* LivescribeTM dot paper products with the same dot pattern at the same time. This prevents a potential problem that can happen when viewing your notebooks in LivescribeTM Desktop: when you write in two notebooks with the same pattern, your notes from the second notebook will be superimposed on your notes from the first notebook when you view them in LivescribeTM Desktop.

Because Livescribe[™] dot paper Products are important to working with your Livescribe smartpen, you should learn to manage and archive them.

Guidelines for Managing Paper Products

Understanding how your Livescribe smartpen interacts with Livescribe[™] dot paper can be challenging. Fortunately, you do not need to know how it all works. All you need to do is follow these guidelines:

- Before using the new paper product, tap on the Notebook Status Label. If it says you are already
 using a notebook with the same number, be sure to archive your old notebooks on Livescribe[™]
 Desktop first. See <u>Checking Paper Product Usage on page 108</u>.
- When purchasing Livescribe[™] dot paper, buy notebooks or journals that have different numbers than the ones you are currently using. To learn about Livescribe[™] dot paper numbering, see <u>About</u> <u>Livescribe[™] Dot Paper Naming on page 108</u>.

- To learn about using packs of notebooks, see <u>Using Packs of Notebooks and Journals on</u> page 109.
- If you own notebooks that have the same naming and numbering, use them sequentially. See <u>Using</u>
 Notebooks with Same Names and Numbers on page 109.
- Archive your notebooks and journals after you have finished with them. For more information, see Archiving Paper Products on page 110.

Checking Paper Product Usage

Each Livescribe[™] dot paper product has a Notebook Status Label. Using the Notebook Status Label is the best way to tell if you are currently using a Livescribe[™] dot paper product that has the same dot pattern.



To use the Notebook Status Label:

- When you open a new Livescribe[™] dot paper product, tap on its Notebook Status Label with your Livescribe smartpen.
- 2. Your Livescribe smartpen display will show whether you are using another Livescribe[™] dot paper product with the same dot pattern. If you are, archive the older Livescribe[™] dot paper product before using the new one. See <u>Archiving Paper Products on page 110</u>.
- 3. In some cases, your Livescribe smartpen will need to be updated to use a new paper product. If this occurs, your smartpen display will indicate this when you tap the Notebook Status Label. To use the new paper product, run Livescribe™ Desktop, dock your Livescribe smartpen, and accept the option to update your smartpen firmware and software.

About Livescribe™ Dot Paper Naming

Livescribe identifies a Livescribe[™] dot paper product by a group (such as Lined Notebook) and a number (from 1 to 8). Any two Livescribe[™] dot paper products labeled with the same group and number have the same dot pattern.

Each Livescribe[™] dot paper product belongs to a *group* based on its format (lined, unlined, grid...) and form factor (notebook, journal, notepad ...).

Livescribe further identifies each paper product with a *number*. Within a group, paper products labeled with the same number have the same dot pattern. Paper products labeled with different numbers have different dot patterns. Currently, numbers in a group run from 1 to 8.

Using Notebooks with Same Names and Numbers

If you own two Livescribe[™] dot paper products with the same Group and Number (such as two Lined Notebook 2 paper products), you should follow these guidelines:

- Use only one of the Livescribe[™] dot paper products at a time. Do not use the two paper products at the same time.
- Before starting on the second paper product, archive the first one with Livescribe[™] Desktop.

For example, do not use two Lined Notebook 1 paper products at the same time. Instead, use another lined notebook with a different Number, such as a Lined Notebook 2 or Lined Notebook 3.

If you have used all the Numbers in the Lined Notebook group, you may wish to start a second, unused Lined Notebook 1. To do so, archive the first Lined Notebook 1. Then you can use your Livescribe smartpen on the second Lined Notebook 1.

Using Packs of Notebooks and Journals

A pack of notebooks or journals contains Livescribe[™] dot paper products of the same group. For example, Lined Notebooks come in packs of four (Notebooks 1-4 and 5-8). If you want to buy two or more packs of Lined Notebooks, verify that the Numbers on the Notebook covers are different. For example, buy and use Notebooks 1-4 and Notebooks 5-8 before buying another pack of 1-4 or 5-8.

If you have purchased two packs with the same numbering, the packs will have the same dot pattern. In this case, you should proceed as follows:

- Use all the Livescribe[™] dot paper products in the first pack before starting on the second pack.
- When you have finished with the first pack, archive each Notebook from the first pack and then start using the second pack.

Archiving Paper Products

When you have finished using a Livescribe[™] dot paper product, you should archive it in Livescribe[™] Desktop. To learn how to archive a Livescribe[™] dot paper product, see the *Livescribe[™] Desktop User Guide*. Archiving a Livescribe[™] dot paper product does the following:

- Frees up storage space on your Livescribe smartpen
- Enables you to use another Livescribe[™] dot paper product that has the same dot pattern as the
 one you archived. Livescribe[™] dot paper products with the same dot pattern have the same name.
- Moves your notes and audio for a Livescribe[™] dot paper product into an Archived Notebooks folder in the Library Pane of Livescribe[™] Desktop. Your notes and audio remain interactive in Livescribe[™] Desktop, just like non-archived Livescribe[™] dot paper products.
- Deletes your notes (ink data) and audio from your Livescribe smartpen. Because of this, your Livescribe smartpen will no longer interact with the physical Livescribe[™] dot paper product that you archived. That is, when you tap the notes in your archived physical notebook, they will not play back any audio.

IMPORTANT:

- Do not archive a notebook unless you are finished using the physical notebook and are ready to set it aside.
- Once you have archived a notebook, do not go back to its physical notebook and start writing on it
 again, unless you have unused pages and want to treat them as a part of a new notebook. For
 example, you could archive a notebook that is partially completed, and then use the remaining
 pages as a second notebook.
- If you are using multiple computers to manage your smartpen data, be sure to archive your notebooks on all of these computers.

Static Electricity, ESD, and the Livescribe™ Smartpen

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can cause damage to electronic devices if discharged into the device, so you should take steps to avoid such an occurrence.

Description of ESD

Static electricity is an electrical charge caused by the buildup of excess electrons on the surface of a material. To most people, static electricity and ESD are nothing more than annoyances. For example, after walking over a carpet while scuffing your feet, building up electrons on your body, you may get a static shock—the discharge event—when you touch a metal doorknob. This little shock discharges the built-up static electricity.

ESD-Susceptible Equipment

Even a small amount of ESD can harm circuitry, so when working with electronic devices, take measures to help protect your electronic devices, including your Livescribe smartpen, from ESD harm. While Livescribe has built protections against ESD into its products, ESD unfortunately exists and, unless neutralized, could build up to levels that could harm your equipment. Any electronic device that contains an external entry point for plugging in anything from cables to docking stations is susceptible to entry of ESD. Devices that you carry with you, such as your handheld, build up ESD in a unique way because the static electricity that may have built up on your body is automatically passed to the device. Then, when the device is connected to another device such as a docking station, a discharge event can occur.

Precautions against ESD

Make sure to discharge any built-up static electricity from yourself and your electronic devices *before* touching an electronic device or connecting one device to another. The recommendation from

Livescribe is that you take this precaution before connecting your smartpen to your computer, placing your smartpen in a cradle, or connecting it to any other device. You can do this in many ways, including the following:

- Ground yourself when you are holding your mobile device by simultaneously touching a metal
 surface that is at earth ground. For example, if your computer has a metal case and is plugged into
 a standard three prong grounded outlet, touching the case should discharge the ESD on your body.
- Increase the relative humidity of your environment.
- Install ESD-specific prevention items, such as grounding mats.

Conditions that enhance ESD Occurrences

Conditions that can contribute to the buildup of static electricity in the environment include the following:

- Low relative humidity.
- Material type. (The type of material gathering the charge. For example, synthetics are more prone
 to static buildup than natural fibers like cotton.)

Cleaning Your Livescribe™ Smartpen

If your smartpen appears sluggish or non-responsive when you interact with printed controls, the infrared lens at its tip may be dirty. Clean this lens with an alcohol wipe.

Clean the exterior of your smartpen with a clean, soft cloth dampened slightly with water.

Disposal

Do not dispose of this product in the trash. As with any product containing batteries, check with your local waste or recycling company to determine the correct disposal method and location in your area.

Hearing Notice

Long-term exposure to the playback of loud recordings, at high volume, may result in permanent hearing loss. When using earbuds or headphones, it is recommended that recordings are listened to at moderate volumes. Set the volume to a safe level. A rule of thumb is that the recorded audio should not be so loud that you cannot hear people speaking to you.

12 Frequently Asked Questions

Recording Notes and Audio

Can I capture notes without recording audio?

Yes. To capture notes simply turn your smartpen on and begin writing on Livescribe[™] dot paper. To record audio, tap the record button in your included notebook.

Can I record audio without Livescribe dot paper?

Yes. Press and hold the smartpen power button until you see the recording timer appear on the display. When you are done recording simply turn off the smartpen. To play back the audio, go to the smartpen's Main Menu, select Paper Replay™, and then select Play session. While you are playing back the audio, you can write down notes on dot paper and the audio will automatically link to your notes.

Can I add new notes to the audio that I've already recorded?

Yes. You can always listen to your recorded audio later and write additional notes. Tap on your original notes to start playing back the audio. Then write on dot paper to link your new notes to the existing audio.

How do I change the audio recording quality?

To adjust recording quality, go to the smartpen Main Menu, scroll down to Settings, select Recording quality, and then choose High, Medium, or Low. Higher quality recordings will take up more space in your smartpen memory.

Smartpen Accessories

How do I replace my ink cartridge?

Grab the tip of the ink cartridge with your fingers and pull it out. Once the ink cartridge is removed, slide in a new one.

Livescribe Desktop

How do I organize my notes?

You can create Custom Notebooks in Livescribe[™] Desktop to organize and better manage your pages. A Custom Notebook is similar to a music playlist, or a digital photo album, but instead of pointing to user-selected songs or pictures, it points (links) to user-selected pages in their source notebooks.

On Windows:

- Choose File > Custom Notebooks > Create. Or, click the Create new Custom Notebook link under Custom Notebooks in the Library tab.
- 2. In the Notebook Name dialog, type in a name for the new notebook. Click OK.
- Livescribe Desktop creates and opens the new notebook and places it in the Library tab under the heading Custom Notebooks.
- 4. Drag and drop the page(s) to the Custom Notebook name in the Library Pane. The pages you selected appear in the Custom Notebook.
- 5. You can organize the pages in a Custom Notebook by simply dragging, moving, and dropping them into their new order.
- 6. You can view information about the source of a page by hovering over it with a mouse cursor. Source information includes the smartpen associated with the page, its notebook, and source page number.

On Mac:

 Choose File > Create Custom Notebooks. Livescribe Desktop creates an empty custom notebook and places it in the Navigation pane under the heading Custom Notebooks.

- 2. To add pages to a custom notebook, select one or more pages in Page View and drag and drop them onto the custom notebook in the Navigation pane.
- To add pages from Audio View, select one or more sessions that have associated pages and drag and drop them onto the custom notebook.
- You can organize the pages in a Custom Notebook by simply dragging, moving, and dropping them into their new order.

What can I share?

Using Livescribe Desktop, you can share pages, Paper Replay audio sessions, or both. Livescribe Desktop gives you several export options for this content, including:

- pencast file: a portable format unique to Livescribe content capable of being imported and used in Livescribe Desktop.
- Adobe® Flash® movie (Livescribe Online uploads only)
- Adobe® PDF format
- Standard audio formats
- Standard image formats

How do I share my pencasts as .pencast files?

One way to share pencasts is to upload your smartpen content (audio, pages, or both) to your myLivescribe account on Livescribe Online. You can keep it private, share it with others, or share with the Livescribe community.

Another way to share pencasts is to export them as .pencast files. A .pencast file is a proprietary file format unique to Livescribe content. This kind of file can be imported directly into Livescribe Desktop by anyone who has it.

On Windows:

- 1. In Pages View, choose one or more pages whose content you want to share. Note: You can also export .pencast files from Audio View. In Audio view, choose or play the session you want to share.
- Click the Share button on the Main Toolbar
- 3. Using the cascading menus, select the type of data you want to share and how to share it. Your options are to share: The entire current notebook associated with your selected page(s).

- The specific page(s) you selected.
- 5. Using the cascading menus, choose: As Pencast.
- In the Select Data for Pencast dialog, choose what to share: Pages and Audio, Pages Only, or Audio Only.
- Refine your sharing options: If you are sharing pages, use the checkboxes to select pages individually or select all pages.
- 8. If you are sharing audio only or audio and pages, select one or more audio sessions to export from the Select Audio to Share drop down list.

On Mac:

- In Pages View, choose one or more pages you want to share. Or, in Sessions View, select one or more sessions to share.
- Click one of the share buttons on the Main Toolbar, or right-click and choose Share. This opens the share dialog. Choose a sharing option.
- 3. Click the Export Pencast button to export a .pencast file. The .pencast file is a portable format unique to Livescribe content. This kind of file can be imported directly into Livescribe Desktop by anyone who has it. Only one audio file allowed per .pencast file. Your computer.
- Use the share dialog to specify what to share.
- 5. Give a name to the content you are sharing, and if required, provide log in information.
- Click Share to share the content.

How can I share pencasts using a MyLivescribe account?

Once you register your smartpen, you can share up to 500MB through your MyLivescribe account.

Private sharing: All your uploaded pencasts are set to private by default – only accessible to you. You can add specific people to your Access List, giving them permission to see your private pencasts, and then send them a link to view. The people on your Access List will be required to create a Livescribe account to view pencasts.

Public sharing: Once you make your pencast public, it can be accessed by anyone, even without a Livescribe account. You can send the pencast URL, share it on Facebook™, or embed it on a website.

How do I share my notes as a PDF?

On Windows:

- 1. In Livescribe™ Desktop's Pages View, choose one or more pages you want to share.
- Click the Share button on Main Toolbar.
- 3. Using the cascading menus, select the type of data you want to share and how to share it. Your options are to share:
 - The entire current notebook associated with your selected page(s).
 - The specific page(s) you selected.
- 4. Using the cascading menus, choose: As PDF...
- In the Save PDF dialog, type the PDF file name and choose a folder for the file.

On Mac:

- 1. Select one or more pages in Pages View.
- 2. Click the Print button or choose File > Print. The Print dialog opens.
- 3. In the Print dialog, click the PDF button and select Save as PDF.
- 4. Click Print.

How do I share my recordings into an audio file?

On Windows:

- 1. In Livescribe Desktop Audio view, choose the session or sessions you want to share.
- Click the Share button on Main Toolbar.
- 3. Using the cascading menus, choose As Audio file.
- **4.** In the Export Session dialog, type the audio file name and choose a folder for the file.
- Choose the audio file format.
- Click Save.

On Mac:

1. In Audio view, select the session to export as a file.

- Choose File > Export as AAC, or choose the contextual menu item by pressing control-click. The Save dialog opens.
- Select a destination to save to.
- 4. Save the session name as it is, or type a new one.
- Click Save. Your audio file is saved to the specified location and is available for listening on your computer or for export.
- **6.** Double-click on the item to play in QuickTime, or drag it into your iTunes library or to your iTunes icon to play in iTunes.

How do I get the latest software updates?

Whenever you launch Livescribe Desktop, it will automatically check for updates and notify you if an update is available for your smartpen and/or Livescribe Desktop. Make sure to download and install all updates, so you'll always have the latest, greatest features. You can also manually check for updates through Livescribe Desktop. Click on the Help menu and select Check for Updates.

Can I convert my handwriting into text?

Yes. You can buy and download additional software called MyScript[®] for Livescribe. It works with Livescribe Desktop to convert legible handwritten notes into editable text. For more information, go to: www.visionobjects.com.

Can I use my smartpen with more than one computer?

Yes. If you use multiple computers, make sure to connect your smartpen and transfer your data to each computer on a regular basis. Make sure you use the same username (email address) and password for each copy of Livescribe Desktop you install. Every time you archive a notebook on one computer, be sure to archive it on your other computers as well.

How do I print my own dot paper?

To print your own dot paper, you need to have Livescribe Desktop version 2.0 or later and an Adobe PostScript-compatible color laser printer with a print resolution of 600 dpi or greater.

1. Within Livescribe Desktop, click on Pages so you are viewing your notes. In the menu, select Tools.

- On a Mac[®], choose Print Your Own Notebook. If you are using Windows[®], choose Printable Notepads.
- Choose the notepad you would like to print, the printer you want to print to, and click Print

Can I change the date and time format?

Yes. You can set your smartpen to display the time in 12- or 24-hour format, and the date in any of several formats. You can find format options on your smartpen under: Main Menu> Settings> Time Format or Main Menu> Settings> Date Format.

Smartpen Shortcuts

Whether you are a beginning, intermediate or advanced user, the following shortcuts will help you get the most out of your smartpen.

Double-tap

When the smartpen asks you for input (like drawing a button, or writing a word for translation), to signal you are finished writing, rapidly tap twice in the same spot on dot paper.

Draw your own Nav Plus

Draw a plus with two lines about an inch long, then double-tap the center quickly. You should see Main Menu on the smartpen display. Tap on the Nav Plus to view and select menu items.

Flick and Scrub (quickly scroll through menu items)

On dot paper, press the tip of your smartpen down for half a second until you hear a short beep. Then, without lifting your smartpen tip off the paper, draw a horizontal or vertical line. Your smartpen will automatically recognize this line as a flick and scrub control. Retrace the line anytime to scroll through menu items or display text.

Quick Launch (jump to an application and quickly launch it)

Double-tap on the center of the Nav Plus control. Then start writing the first few letters of the application name, continuing until you see the name appear on the display. Tap the right arrow of your Nav Plus to launch the application. You can later tap on what you wrote to re-launch the application.

Launch Line

Similar to Quick Launch, you can use Launch Line to quickly launch any Open Paper application installed on your smartpen. Open Paper applications are applications that do not require pre-printed paper controls to function.

- 1. Draw a horizontal line on your notebook (starting from right or left) and without removing your smartpen tip from the page, immediately double back on the line ending close to where you started.
- 2. Immediately write the name of the target application above the line.
- 3. To launch the application, tap on the application name you have written. You can later tap on what you wrote to re-launch the application.

You can use the Launch Line tap-around feature to navigate the application. You can tap just above, below, left, or right of the application name to perform corresponding functions of the Nav Plus.

Paper Replay™ Password

Keep your recorded Paper Replay[™] sessions private. To set up Paper Replay Password protection:

- 1. Power on your smartpen.
- 2. Go to the Main Menu by tapping the center of the Nav Plus at the bottom of your Livescribe Dot Paper.
- Tap down to Paper Replay.
- 4. Tap down to Password protection to set your 4-digit password.
- 5. Write a 4-digit password on your dot paper notebook. You can disguise your password by using any of the following methods:
 - Write the numbers in a different order (for example, backwards).
 - Write the numbers in various places on the same page.
 - After writing and confirming your password, go back and write other numbers over your password to disguise it.

6. After setting your password, your smartpen will prompt you for your password each time you try to play back a session. Once you turn off password protection, all previously set passwords are permanently erased.

13 Glossary

Refer to the list below for Livescribe terms and their definitions.

3-D recording headset. Earphones with embedded microphones that capture multi-directional, far-field audio and place objects in the sound landscape surrounding you.

active ink. Notes, drawings, or other markings made by a Livescribe smartpen on Livescribe[™] dot paper that are associated to recorded audio. By default, active ink is displayed as green in Livescribe[™] Desktop. See *inactive ink*.

archiving. The process of moving your notes and audio for a Livescribe[™] dot paper product into an Archived Notebooks folder in the Navigation Pane. This process also deletes your notes (ink data) and audio from the Livescribe smartpen. Because of this, the Livescribe smartpen will no longer interact with the physical Livescribe[™] dot paper product that you archived.

audio. Sound of any kind that is captured by the Livescribe smartpen microphone.

Audio (or Sessions) view. Sessions presented as a list of files with details about each.

browsing. Paging through a notebook's pages.

docking. Connecting a Livescribe smartpen to a personal computer by inserting the smartpen into its charging cradle (for Pulse[™] smartpens) or Micro-USB cable (for Echo[™] smartpens).

downloading. Receiving data from a remote location.

Echo™ smartpen. A model of smartpen manufactured by Livescribe Inc.

firmware. Software that manages the internal operations of a smartpen.

flash storage. Non-volatile storage of computer files, not dependent on electric charge. Sometimes referred to as memory.

Flick and Scrub. Flick and Scrub is a feature that enables fast scrolling through menu items and other displayed text on the Livescribe smartpen. This feature is useful when text presented by an application is longer than the display can show horizontally or when multiple menus, options, or items are available vertically.

inactive ink. Notes, drawings, or other markings made by a Livescribe smartpen on Livescribe[™] dot paper that are not associated to recorded audio. By default, inactive ink is displayed as black in Livescribe[™] Desktop. See *active ink*

ink. The markings of the Livescribe smartpen ballpoint on dot paper. See active ink and inactive ink.

Launch Line. Launch Line is similar to Quick Launch. You can use Launch Line to quickly launch any Open Paper application installed on your smartpen. Open Paper applications are applications that do not require pre-printed paper controls to function. See tap around.

linking. Associating a Livescribe smartpen to an instance of Livescribe™ Desktop.

Livescribe™ Desktop. The computer component of the Livescribe™ platform. Livescribe™ Desktop allows you to transfer, store, search, and replay notes from your computer. You can also upload your content to the Web, and manage applications and content on the Livescribe smartpen.

Livescribe™ dot paper. Plain paper printed with a microdot pattern. Invented by Anoto AB, and used under license by Livescribe. The microdots are nearly invisible to the human eye. The microdots enable the Livescribe smartpen to recognize areas on a page, like a printed record button for Paper Replay™, and associate handwritten notes with recorded audio.

Livescribe™ Online. Livescribe Web community. Livescribe smartpen owners have free membership in Livescribe Online, where members can store up to 500 MB of their sessions. In addition, members can share sessions with others and participate in user forums.

microdot. The basic unit of Livescribe's *dot paper*: a small, light-gray circular marking that is arranged with others like it into millions of patterns. These are printed on Livescribe paper products for use with the Livescribe smartpen.

myLivescribe profile. 500 MB of personal space a Livescribe smartpen user is allotted at Livescribe Online to store and share notes.

Nav Plus. A pre-printed or hand-drawn plus sign that lets you navigate the Livescribe smartpen applications and files.

notebook. A generic term used in this guide that represents any Livescribe[™] dot paper type: Lined Notebook, Lined Black Journal, Unlined Black Journal, or Unlined Red journal.

notebook status label. An elliptical paper seal that prevents a Livescribe paper product from being opened until detached by the owner. This label defines the product's *status* (paper type and series number), so you can be aware of potential conflict with paper products of the same status that are already in use.

notes. Anything written or drawn on dot paper.

OLED display. 18pixel x 98pixel Organic Light Emitting Diode display screen of the Livescribe smartpen.

Pages View. A view in LivescribeTM Desktop that displays notebook pages. Notes are shown as *active ink* if they are associated with audio.

Paper Replay™. An application that associates what you write on paper to audio you record.

Paper Replay Password. Paper Replay Password sets a password for your Paper Replay sessions. Setting a password can prevent others from listening to your recorded audio on your smartpen.

PDF. A graphic file format that is used to export writings and drawings saved in Livescribe[™] Desktop. PDF files can be viewed on or printed from any computer with Adobe Acrobat Reader[®] installed.

pencast. Pencasting is a general term for exporting smartpen content. Pencasting and is how you share your smartpen content with others. You can pencast smartpen content to your computer or to Livescribe Online.

.pencast. A proprietary file format of Livescribe Inc. that stores smartpen content (pages, audio, or both). These files can be exported and imported by Livescribe Desktop to allow sharing of smartpen content.

preferences. Settings of Livescribe™ Desktop that conform to your way of working.

Pulse™ smartpen. A model of smartpen manufactured by Livescribe Inc.

quick commands. A series of commands you can write on dotted paper to quickly learn the current status of the Livescribe smartpen.

session. A single, complete audio recording that begins with the Record command and ends with the Stop command on the Livescribe smartpen. A session always contains audio and optionally can contain associated written notes (pages).

Sessions (or Audio) view. Sessions presented in Livescribe™ Desktop as a list of files with details about each.

Single-Page View (or mode). A view or mode in Livescribe[™] Desktop in which a single page is displayed at a time.

tap around. Tap around is a feature of Launch Line that is an alternate to using the Nav Plus to navigate menus of an application.

thumbnail. A small representation of a page.

Thumbnail View (or mode). A view or mode in Livescribe[™] Desktop that shows thumbnail representations of pages.

transfer. Copying data from a Livescribe smartpen to a computer using Livescribe[™] Desktop. (In this context, the sessions remain on the smartpen.)

updating. Installing a new version of software or firmware via Livescribe[™] Desktop to your computer or smartpen.

uploading. Sending data to a remote location, such as the web.

USB. Universal Serial Bus, a standard for wired connection between personal computers and peripheral devices like printers and the Livescribe smartpen.

USB mobile charging cradle. A cradle that charges and connects a Livescribe smartpen to your computer.

zooming. The process or magnifying or reducing pages in Livescribe™ Desktop.


